At the meeting a representative from the Aveland History Group spoke about their stained glass Jubilee project and asked if BPC could offer some funding towards this. They were advised that this would be discussed at our July meeting. A parishioner raised concerns about dog poo and asked if additional litterbins could be installed on Birthorpe Road. They were advised that we had approached SKDC on two previous occasions regarding this and had been advise on both occasions that they didn't have sufficient staff to manage emptying any additional bins. Since the meeting we have once again approached SKDC and unfortunately were met with the same response of **NO**. Another parishioner asked about the plans to possibly development the Hall Field into a managed green space for all. They were assured that nothing would go ahead without full consultation with the village and that the idea was purely in its 'egg' stage. Another asked about our plans for the Aveland field and was advised that several options are currently being investigated and that the village will be consulted before any final decision is made.

Flooding in West Rd car park — continues to be an issue despite extensive works to resolve this. Cllr Hill is aware of the situation and has assured us that further works to address the issue are in the pipeline.

The Jitty — between Brewery Lane and Burton Lane continues to deteriorate, however; we have been assured by Cllr Hill that LCC will be undertaking works to address the situation.

Repairs to the play area – will be undertaken in the next few weeks, however; these should not cause too much disruption to its use, as they should hopefully be completed within a day.

Our tennis courts are open — and open access and free use continues and will do so as long as they are used appropriately. However; several youths are threatening this privilege being withdrawn, as they have taken to using the area as their private 'velodrome'. We politely ask that you advise your children that no wheeled vehicle is allowed on the court or the five a side area as they seriously damage the surface— **thank you.**

Broken glass — has also been an issue in the recreation ground on the skate park area. If you witness this being done or find broken glass please contact our clerk — **thank you**.

Dog poo — is the most unacceptable and offensive type of litter on our streets and in the **Recreation Ground!** If you're a dog walker please ensure you pick up after your dog and dispose of it in your bin or a litterbin **not** in the hedge or on the verge in a plastic bag!! **Thank you.**
