Due to a recent resignation we have a Councillor vacancy - so if you'd like to make a difference and help shape the future of your village, now is your opportunity to do so. If no election is requested, we will hold selection interviews to choose a councillor via co-option at our meeting on **13**th **September**.

Change to Council Meetings — in order to accommodate the ever increasing workload the Council has to manage, it was agreed at our July meeting to meet 9 times a year instead of 6, from January 2023. Therefore; we will meet on the second Tuesday of January, February, March, June, July, September, October and November.

LIVES Donation – the Council's recent £100 donation to LIVES was gratefully received.

Now is the time - to let us know what you'd like us to budget for when we plan our expenditure for the coming year at our November meeting. So if there's anything specific you'd like to see happen in 2023/24 or long term please let our Clerk know by **31**st **October**. We can make choices on your behalf **but** *it would be much better if our decisions were based on your desires!*

EV charging point – the Council is currently considering the possibility of installing a pay as you use community electric vehicle charging point and would like your views on this. We could most probably get a grant of around 60% toward the initial purchase, installation and projected maintenance costs. So do you think this would be beneficial to the village or not. Please give your comments to our Clerk by **31**st **October**.

Repairs to the play area – have been completed and quotes to address repairs to the skate park and play park entrance gate are currently being sourced.

Can you help? — we are looking for a kind soul to look after our *Folkingham Road planter*. All it entails is watering once a week and a little bit of weeding or dead heading. So if you can spare **15** mins a week we'd love to hear from you.

Folkingahm Road's potholes and craters — in response to the Council's concerns and comments Cllr Martin Hill has requested that LCC put this road on their list for a complete upgrade.

HGVs in West Road – following a request from the Council Cllr Martin Hill met with the site manager of Worldwide Logistics Group, to discuss residents' concerns over HGVs using West Road to access their site. Consequently the company have agreed to install signs on Station Road directing all HGVs past West Road toward their Station Road access gate. The Company will also liaise with concerned residents. Some residents had also requested that a weight limit be imposed on West Road. *Unfortunately*, such a limit wouldn't solve the problem as the site's West Rd entrance is a legal access point.

Freedom to roam with a Concessionary Bus Pass — if you are in receipt of a state pension or have a listed disability, you are eligible to apply for one of these passes. There's no application or renewal charge and applications can now be made online at <u>www.lincsbus.info/freedom</u> or by telephone on **0345 456 4474**. The bus pass allows free travel on off- peak scheduled bus services in England, however; *in Lincolnshire they can also be used on local journeys before 9.30 am if the journey originated in Lincolnshire*. So they're well worth applying for, even if you just use it occasionally.
