Calling all community heroes — an opportunity awaits you to help make a difference to your village and look after its interests by becoming a **councillor**. 6th May 2023 is the date for the Coronation of his majesty King Charles III - If you have ideas as to how the village should celebrate this momentous occasion or wish to organise something, please let us know.

To commemorate King Charles Ill's coronation — the Council voted to install a bench on the north side of the recreation ground.

Flooding in West Street – following advice by LCC that Anglia Water were responsible for rectifying the problem, our Clerk contacted them. However; following two visits by them to investigate, they concluded that there was no blockage in their system, advising that it must be in LCC's. So in brief we are no further forward, though we are continuing to liaise with ClIr Hill and LCC re the problem.

Do you have an opinion on the proposed Washdyke Solar Farm or reservoir? – Then we'd like to hear from you. Remember we can only represent the village's opinion if we know it.

Big changes are a foot for our churches — information about the proposals can be found by going to https://www.lincoln.anglican.org/ttct. After careful consideration our church has voted to apply to be a 'Local Mission Church', in amalgamation with the Folkingham church/South Lafford group. It is hoped that by doing so, we'd be allocated a vicar to share with them. It is anticipated that the vicar would live in the Folkingham Vicarage and undertake services in our and their church on alternative Sundays. If the application is successful; our church will have three years to demonstrate that it can meet the required financial commitment, which at present given their current financial situation may be a struggle. Pop in too – is a weekly coffee morning held on a Wednesday in the village hall at 10am.
