Annual Parish Meeting

1. Welcome.

001. The Chairman welcomed the members of the public and explained the rules under which the meeting would be conducted.

2. Chairman's Annual Report.

- b. 007. The issue regarding the depth of water at Springwells was raised. Cllr Stafford explained the nature of the extensive work that had been carried out and that the levels could be governed if necessary. The council agreed that they would monitor the situation.
- c. 008. The issue of the general condition of the churchyard was brought up. The meeting was informed that it was the responsibility of SKDC and Cllr Hansen (SKDC) agreed that he would take up the matter.
