We are pleased to welcome – Calvin Williamson to the Council. Calvin took up office following co-option at our September meeting. So if you're interested in joining us all you need to do is send your completed application to our Clerk by **Nov 13**th.

Please let us know what you'd like us to budget for - when we plan our expenditure for the coming year at our November meeting on the **14**th **November**. So if there's anything specific you'd like to see happen in 2024/25 or long term please let our Clerk know by **12**th **November**. We can make choices on your behalf though <u>it would be much better if our decisions were based on your desires!</u>

Our Coronation bench – which is made of recycled materials to reflect King Charles' ethos, is now in place in the recreation ground - so why not go and give it try? We'd love to hear what you think of it. Our **thanks** go to the members of the cricket club who very kindly installed it for us!!

Future grass cutting – it was unanimously agreed at our September meeting to continue cutting all our main grassed areas as per our usual schedule next year and to not cutting the Aveland field from May until the end of August.

Straw – we raised villagers concerns about the amount of straw being deposited in the village with Cllr Hill and asked if anything could be done to eradicate this problem. Unfortunately due to lack of legislation in this area, he suggested that all we can do is to keep requesting a street clean via report it on SKDC website.

Jitties- we are pleased to advise that LCC have now repaired the Brewery/Burton Lane jitty and we thank Cllr Martin Hill for his assistance with this matter. We are now liaising with him re the possibility of LCC also repairing the three jitties joining the High Street to West Rd.

Folkingham Road resurfacing – we have been advised by Cllr Hill that these works will now not be undertaken until next year. We will of course keep reiterating to him how urgent these works are!!

Footpaths – we are currently liaising with Cllr Hill re the possibility of LCC resurfacing all our eroding/dangerous footpaths.

Flooding in West Rd car park – at our request Cllr Hill arranged for LCC to 'suck out' out the drain in this car park. Unfortunately flooding has occurred since then, so we will continue liaising with him and lobby SKDC until this issue is resolved.

SKDC off street parking places Civil Enforcement order 2023 in respect to West Rd car park – unfortunately was agreed and came into place on the 12th September. Full details of the order can be found at CHttpHandler.ashx (southkesteven.gov.uk In brief it states that no vehicle above 6'6" can park there; no vehicle can remain for more than 48hrs and that the restrictions apply 24hrs a day. SKDC are to erect signage that will advise motorist fully of the new regulations. The council is challenging this decision.

Chapel St- we have requested via Cllr Hill that LCC erect signage at the Chapel St crossroads to avert HGVs accessing the High St via Chapel St.

Worldwide Logistics – in response to complaints and negotiations by both residents, councillors & councils regarding the exceptionally large lorries that have been accessing their site via West Rd, have changed their postcode on google earth and Royal Mail postcode finder to reflect their site entrance on Station Road. This should ensure that all lorries will now enter their depot via their Station Rd entrance. They also intend to erect directional signage on the High St and have provided to an out of hours tel no **0330 043 2370. NB** vehicles for the LCC depot are also using this entrance.

Community speed watch – we are looking for a volunteer/s to manage our speed watch programme. School crossing patrol attendant – there has been an applicant for this role, so hopefully we'll have an attendant in place very soon.

Sadly the Sunday team, despite fighting to the end, were relegated. Looking ahead to 2024 - the two Saturday and one Sunday league teams will again be competing most weeks, they plan to have more Friday night T20 games, running open junior training sessions on Monday nights, the formation of a second Sunday side, aiming to play only friendly cricket, offering a route into cricket for newbies and a way to keep playing for those who consider themselves more senior! The club hopes that they can provide some entertainment for the parish next year and look forward to welcoming any guests wanting to come down and get involved.
