Billingborough Fire Station NEEDS YOU! - Due to extremely low crew numbers at the fire station, there are occasions when the fire engine at Billingborough is not available to attend incidents. Other fire stations are relied on to provide emergency cover to Billingborough and the surrounding area. Consequently; Billingborough fire station is looking for people interested in becoming On Call Fire Fighters. The role is not full time; therefore, you can make yourself available to respond to incidents in and around your primary employment and family commitments. You are also very welcome to pop down to the station on a **Monday night between 6.30 pm – 9pm** for an informal chat with the crew if you wish to find out more.

We are also looking for volunteers to become Councillors – as we are once again only 5 when we should be 9. No qualifications necessary, just the time to attend our nine meetings a year and work for the benefit of our community. More details and the application form can be found on our website. Selection will be via co- option at our meeting on 9th January.

You're always welcome – to join our meetings. Each meeting includes a Public Forum as part of the agenda for residents to ask questions, raise items of concern or simply comment on issues. Submission of questions in advance of the meeting is welcomed, so that they can be answered more fully. **NB** Matters raised that are not included on that agenda will be considered for subsequent agendas.

Your Budget ideas — we received two requests from you- i) to have a litterbin at the allotment entrance to encourage dog walkers to clean up after their dogs — as SKDC are unable to empty any extra bins, it was agreed to ask permission to move the bin from outside the Army hut to the allotment entrance — permission was granted and we are pleased to report that the bin is being used. ii) to consider if the Council would consider funding for a village firework event. It was resolved to ask for further details, to enable further discussion at our January meeting.

Our budget considerations – it was resolved - i) to make increases to our cemetery fees, however; at different rates in order to align the differences between resident and non-resident fees, ii) to increase the rent for the cemetery field, iii) to increase the hourly rate to all our contractors, (the amount being subject to the confirmation of the rise in the NWL), iv) that any obligation in respect to an employee's pension scheme would be adhered to, v) to accept the quote for grass cutting in the village from Glendale & the 3 yr. quote from Indigo 19 for the cemetery, which also includes regular fed and weed treatments, vi) to increase our charge to Parkers for the grass cutting on Blasson Way, vii) to continue with all our yearly subscriptions, viii) to set aside £500 in case a Gov.Uk email address is made mandatory, ix) to continue with our provision to be able to fund our community cleaner, should SKDC withdraw their funding, x) to approach the cricket club and Horbling PC re their voluntary contributions towards the running of the recreation ground, xi) to initiate the planned feasibility studies on two possible projects to ascertain their viability before presenting to the village for consideration.

What's been agreed since our last newsletter? — to accept Crown Estates offer to provide & plant some saplings in Low St paddock, if the tenant is agreeable to this, (they will also care for them long term), to purchase a defibrillator for the recreation ground, to have a professional fire safety and Legionella risk assessment for the pavilion, to replace the pavilion external cupboard door and to replace the pavilion front shutter with security doors with fire exit action locks.

Update on SKDC off street parking places Civil Enforcement order 2023 in respect to West Rd car park – on challenging this order we were advised by SKDC that presently none of the regulations listed in this order will be enforced

Footpaths – 14 submissions were made to FixMystreet re the condition of our pavements, however; only two were deemed requiring attention and the rest not so despite their abysmal state. Consequently our Chairman met with Cllr M Hill and walked around the village to show him just how bad the pavements are and requested that he approach LCC to have the majority of them resurfaced. He agreed that this would be the best way forward but that it may take a while. Meanwhile we will continue to submit to FixMystreet and encourage you to also do so.

Springwells — we politely ask the good intentioned person who has been lifting the sluice **NOT TO DO SO**, as it is being monitored by our caretaker and lifted when clear. If it is lifted when debris is present it may cause a blockage. — **Thank you!**

Community speed watch – we are looking for a volunteer/s to manage our speed watch programme. This would entail undertaking training to be a volunteer and organising our volunteers to undertake routine checks. Please contact our chairman if you're interested or would like more information about the role.
