Your Annual Village Meeting will be held on **14**th **May at 6pm in the Recreation Ground sports pavilion**. This is <u>not</u> a council meeting but one organised by us to give parishioners i.e. **YOU** the opportunity to voice your opinions on what you want for the village or tell everyone about your club, organisation etc. no matter of its size or membership. So why not take this opportunity to voice your ideas or present a report on your club or organisation? As always our clerk will be happy to read them out on your behalf. This meeting will be directly followed by **The Annual Council Meeting**, which you're welcome to attend.

Recent Flood meeting – thank you to all who attended and to those who volunteered to be part of the village's emergency planning team. We are currently trying with the help of Cllr Hill to organise a follow on meeting with the heads of the relevant agencies, LCC and our MP. Items resolved at our March meeting — to accept the quote from Simpson to undertake all essential works as advised in our recent tree survey, to accept the quote from Instantprint for printing the newsletter, that after review of all policies that no changes were required, to accept amendments to the CC agreement and that no changes were required to the cemetery caretaker's contract, to object to the appeal submitted in regard to the proposed solar farm, to accept the Legionella policy and plan and that the recreation ground caretaker would be person to undertake the necessary duties re this and to check the emergency lighting and to ask if he will be willing to do so, with an extra hour per week being added in recognition of the extra work, a budget was agree for extra hours and training, to install the remaining two village entry signs and paint poles at a later date, to reply to LCC suggesting that EVCPs be installed in West Rd car park, to advertise for volunteers for the community speed watch scheme, if this proves unsuccessful to consider selling the equipment, to purchase cap ends for the skate park equipment, not to purchase a D Day flag. Minutes of this meeting can be found on our website.

No mow May – the Council will once again not cut the Aveland field during the month of May in order to boost wild flowers and thus the amount of nectar available to pollinating insects such as bees, butterflies and moths. **You could decide to do this too**.

Our 3 yearly Tree inspection – recently took place identifying that 22 trees required essential work, which has since been quoted for, with the work being planned for May. *Our yearly Playground equipment inspection* – was also recently undertaken, the only required necessary work is the replacement of some caps, which are currently being sourced.

Sports Pavilion — we have recently removed the west facing porch, repaired the roof, fitted new emergency exit bars to the main room doors, installed new showers, installed a defibrillator on the east wall, have had a Legionella and fire risk assessment undertaken and the Cricket Club have redecorated internally.

West St — we recently reported to LCC the fact that one of the businesses on the industrial estate had dug a drainage channel across the yard and inserted a soil pipe under the boundary fence, which will drain onto the road, in an area that floods, querying if planning permission was required. We have since been advised by LCC that they are taking enforcement action.

Hip, Hip Hooray - at long last after several years of requesting that Folkingham Rd be repaired properly, our tenacity as eventually succeeded, as these repairs were recently completed. Our thanks go to Cllr Hill for his help with this matter.

Community Speed Watch – if would you like to train to be part of this or to manage it, please contact our chairman.

Footpath from Pointon to Billingborough — work has started on the part from Pointon to Sempringham, however we have been advised that the path from there to us will not be undertake this year. We will of course keep raising the issue until it is done. The Big Clean have recently tidied part of this path and verge, which has improved it.

Local Plan – SKDC have a new draft local plan 2021 – 2041, which you can view on their website. In it, it proposes the development of 140 new dwellings on the former Aveland site and land to the west of Pointon Rd, consultation closed on 25th April. We will keep you updated re this proposal.

Low St Paddock – we have been advised by the Crown Estates' (CE) agent that the tenant of this paddock is happy for six new trees to be planted there. CE are donating and planting the trees and have granted permission for us to erect a plaque in memory of our late Queen. Design, wording and location of this are yet to be decided on.

Recycling - don't forget to only put clean dry paper & cardboard in your purple bin, tin and plastic in your grey one and general rubbish in your black bin. We have been advised that SKDC intend to introduce a food waste bin.
