## **Billingborough Parish Council Newsletter November 2024**

A time to remember the valour of those who selflessly gave their lives for our freedom – at this year's Remembrance Day service, that will be held in **St Andrews Church, Billingborough on Sunday 10th November at 10.00am.** 

*Would you like to be an influencer*? - Then why not apply to become a councillor. We are looking for enthusiastic and dedicated individuals to help us shape the future of our parish. By joining us you will have the opportunity to influence the decisions made about your village. What does it involve? – attending 9 meetings per year, listening to residents' concerns & ideas, helping make decisions on local issues & on the budget, giving your time to ensure the best outcomes for your village. Why become a Councillor? - You get the opportunity to make a positive impact, you gain experience in local government, you'll be part of a team committed to improving your community and you'll also have a voice to ensure your community thrives. *No experience needed* – interested in finding out more then please contact our clerk. *Mind made up, then applying is easy* - just complete our brief application form, which can be found on our website. You will then be invited to attend our November meeting on the 10th for selection via co-option. If selected you will be able to take part in the evening's meeting, after you have signed a couple of necessary official documents. We'd like to welcome our newest Councillor Helen Middlebrook, who was co- opted at our September meeting. Her details and those of all our Councillors can be found on our website. Helen will be laying the poppy wreath on behalf of the village at this year's Remembrance Service.

The Parish Budget for 24/25 – will be discussed & drafted at our next meeting. We are keen to ensure that it will reflect the needs and priorities of our community. So please let our clerk know what matters to YOU! Or come to the public forum at our meeting and tell us. We can make choices on your behalf though <u>it would be much better if our decisions were based on your desires!</u>

**Poll update** - thank you to all of those that responded to our recent poll re the various development options for the recreation ground. The votes for the five a side & bike track were very close, so we are currently sourcing quotes & designs for both these options. Once we have these, we will consult with the village further. We value everyone's input but would especially like to hear from the young people of the village once we have more concrete plans and are looking at designs.

*Biodiversity* – it was agreed at our October meeting to create a wild flower patch in the far north east corner of the recreation ground, to provide a home for insects, food for pollinators and pleasure for all. We may also look to install bat boxes & descriptive signage. We will be applying to SKDC for funding for this project. If you have any ideas of other council owned areas that you'd like to see rewilding take place then please let our clerk know by 8<sup>th</sup> November.

*Cemetery improvements* – we intend to replace the wooden gates and fencing at our cemetery with wrought iron gates and railings on a small wall. We also plan to add a small gate entrance with access path to the west of the drive. We are currently sourcing designs & costing and looking to see if there is any funding available to help with this project.

*Traffic attendant* – last year we secured a role for a 'lollypop' person to work outside our primary school, to ensure our children can cross the road safely. *Unfortunately this role is still vacant!* It's only fifteen minutes morning and afternoon, so do you think you could do it or perhaps share the role with a friend? *Low St. field trees* – we have been advised by Crown Estates that they will soon be planting 3 Lime trees, 1 Red Oak, 1 Hornbeam & 1 Acer Autumn Blaze in this paddock on behalf of the village to commemorate the life and reign of Queen Elizabeth 2<sup>nd</sup>. We have been granted permission to erect a plaque to mark the planting of the trees and state their dedication and are currently sourcing quotes for this.

Section 19 investigation – initiated because of the flooding in January has been completed, however to date we've had no feedback.

SKDC has a new Customer Service Centre – which is located below its offices in the Picture House, on St Catherine's Rd. It is open Mon – Fri - 9am to 3pm. A number of self-service stations are also available for customers without digital access at home. This provision will enable them to complete online tasks and access online portals such as Council Tax, Choice Based Lettings, Licensing and Planning.

A little reminder to light up at night - when out on your bike & a polite request - to anyone whose trees, shrubs, hedging, etc. overhang the pavement – please cut them back and please can you also sweep up any discarded wet leaves – thank you!

**The Environment agency** – are currently checking their flood risk management assets to ensure that they are functioning correctly, to ensure water can move freely through the channels and thus help prevent flooding.
