Billingborough Parish Council Newsletter March 2025

Flooding -on 6th January - just a year on from heavy rain that caused disruption and road flooding; our village once again experienced heavy rainfall, which this time tragically caused the flooding of thirteen properties and consequently the displacement of the occupants, sadly with many of them still being unable to return to their home. The heavy rainfall also placed many other homes at risk of flooding and cut off access to the village via Folkingham Rd for two days. Volunteers swiftly reacted to the situation as did the emergency services and the Council would like to say a MASSIVE THANK YOU to all those that volunteered on the day and following days to help with cleaning up and the digging out of ditches and drains etc. A section 19 report was initiated after the flooding of 2024, however; the report wasn't released until 20th Jan of this year and really didn't identify reasons for the cause of the flooding or offer any robust solutions. Another section 19 report has been initiated, with results being requested by May. Hopefully this will provide more information as to the cause with swift resolutions. As many of you will be aware an independent Flood Action Group has been formed by Murray Turner, Helen Middlebrook, Julie Green & Krys Sokalo, to try to identify and address the issues that caused the flooding. They are liaising with all the relevant authorities & already two public meetings have taken place, with several of these authorities being in attendance. Unfortunately to date Anglia Water has not engaged with them. To help get an overview of our area and identify issues/concerns, the Resilience Forum brought their drone to our village on the 18th of February to undertake a mapping flight. Due to the accuracy of the data captured by the drone they can overlay elevation & measurement data. They also had use of a LiDAR camera, a specialist survey camera that uses laser rather than visible light. Once the collected data is available it will be shared with us and will hopefully prove beneficially in getting all agencies working towards minimising any future flooding. Unfortunately repetitive flooding is becoming a greater threat to many areas and even if answers are found and solutions quickly implement there is no guarantee that our village will be free from the risk of flooding. Therefore we all need to be aware and vigilant and take notice of flood warnings, which you can sign up for at-https://www.gov.uk/signup-for-flood-warnings. You can receive warnings via phone, mobile, email & text. You can also check your long term risk at www.gov.uk/check-long-term-flood-risk. If you receive an alert prepare by packing a bag with essentials, meds & insurance docs. If you receive a warning turn off all utilities, move valuables upstairs (if feasible) & swiftly move family, pets & vehicles to safety. You can report surface flooding – to LCC on 01522 782082, for small rivers call the Environment Agency on 0800 807060, for sewers call Anglian Water on 0345 145 145. If your property should be unfortunate to be flooded call 999 if in immediate danger. Unfortunately we all need to be more flood aware & if at direct risk, perhaps start considering installing some flood defence items (many of these can be improvised) & have a plan should we unfortunately become at risk of immediate flooding. We also need to ensure that we carry out our riparian duties. Unfortunately in January our sandbags were stored in the area that flooded so were inaccessible to us. To prevent a similar situation occurring again Wayne Chessum has secured the use of a shipping container at the WW Logistics site, where there is now a supply of pre filled sandbags, provided by SKDC. It is hoped that in time other items will be acquired to help should we have any threat of flooding. Wayne's also recruited several volunteers to help should such a situation arise. If you'd like to volunteer please contact him on 07717 281817. The Council supports the Flood Action Group & is working with them & with Wayne, however; we also feel that it would be beneficial for the village to have a general emergency response team, which would be supported by Steve Eason-Harris, the Emergency Planning & Business Continuity Officer, with Lincs Fire & Rescue, so if you'd like to help form/be part of a general emergency response team, please contact our clerk.

Your Annual Village Meeting - will be held on **13**th **May at 6pm in the Recreation Ground sports pavilion**. This is <u>*not*</u> a council meeting but one organised by us to give parishioners i.e. *YOU* the opportunity to voice your opinions on what you want for the village or tell everyone about your club, organisation etc. no matter of its size or membership. So why not take this opportunity to voice your ideas or present a report on your club or organisation? As always our clerk will be happy to read them out on your behalf. This meeting will be directly followed by *The Annual Council Meeting*, which you're welcome to attend.

New Councillors – we are very pleased to announce that we have two new Councillors Julie Green & Andy Sharpe, whose contact details can be found on our website. Their joining out team means that we now only have one vacancy. So if you've been considering joining us, best get your application in before the opportunity to help shape and support your village is no longer available. A brief application form can be found on our website. **NB** Selection will be by co-option at our meeting on **11/3/25**.

Precept for 2025/26 - was set at £19,500 an increase of 9.7%, (last year it was 10.9%), which equates to an extra 3.45p on a Band D property, ie.39.38p, last year this was 35.93p. **Budget** – income £43k, (£23k + precept of £19,500) expenditure £72K, reserve of £29K, full details can be found on our website.

"No waiting at any time signage" – a proposal to extend this on the High St opposite the Fire Station was discussed at our February meeting & there were no objections from the Council in regard to this proposal.

Bio diversity project – the Council's application to SKDC's bio diversity fund was successful, so sowing of wild flower seeds will take place in the far north eastern corner of the recreation ground playing field once the weather improves – it will be 'blooming marvellous!"

Low St Paddock – recently the Crown Estate planted six trees, that it kindly donated to the village to commemorate the life of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 2nd. We are currently in the process of commissioning a plaque to recognise this donation and also Her Majesty. The plaque will be displayed on the railings to left of the gate on Low St.

Land registered – we are pleased to announce that our recreation ground is now registered with Land Registry. Applications to register all our other unregistered land are currently in progress.

Newsletter – in response to public demand it was agreed at our January meeting to continue with a hardcopy of our newsletter.
