Billingborough Parish Council Newsletter July 2025

The Emergency Planning forum - held on 11th June was very well attended by residents of our village & of surrounding villages. The aims and advantages for having an emergency team in our village were clearly explained by Steve Eason-Harris, the Emergency Planning & Business Continuity Officer, with Lincs Fire & Rescue. For those who couldn't attend & might be saying why do we need one of these as we have a flood team? The answer is – this will be a team that would respond to any emergency not just flooding, it would also give us a direct route into accessing help from Steve's team – (we didn't receive their help earlier in January's flooding because no one had contacted his team, consequently they weren't aware of our dire situation), receiving alerts to any potential disaster & regular training to deal with them. We'd also be given an emergency box containing two way radios, high vis jackets & other items, plus a portable weather station. Setting up the plan would only take three or four people, (though more could be involved if they wished to) who would become the main contacts & who'd co- ordinate the volunteer helpers – which we hope will be numerous. Although, the Council is initiating this, it will not be the Council's plan – it will be the Village's plan & Steve will help us develop it! In order to have a more effective response to any emergency one of the main aims will be to work collaboratively with the Flood Team & at least the villages of Pointon, Horbling, Folkingham & Swaton including doing the locally delivered training together, (where possible). The Flood Pod is coming to our village – on 28th July from 11am – 6pm, which will be situated in the recreation ground car park. This is a flood prevention event being hosted by SKDC, for more details please go to Welcome to the NEW FloodPOd! – FloodMary

Flood updates - the drone footage taken by Steve's team of our area early this year is now available & can be viewed by going to https://sitescan-eu1.arcgis.com/share/145979c0-3807-4681-a911-83c2442022c3. There will also be a QR code posted on our website.

Telemetry machines - Funding has been secured by Brett Rycott-Jones, the Flood Resilience Programme Coordinator, with LCC to purchase several for our village. These will be placed in areas identified by the village and will allow real time monitoring of water levels & therefore possible flood predication, meaning we should be more prepared should a possible flood be identified. These machines will be fully maintained free of charge for ten years. Sewage clearing - over the last few weeks teams have been clearer out sewers in various parts of the village, which should have a positive impact to help minimise flooding. Billingborough Flood Group (BFG) report - The Environmental Agency (EA) have now issued the flood reports following the January 6th floods which the Billingborough Flood Group (BFG) have scrutinised in detail. The BFG have sent a comprehensive list of queries to the EA who have shared the queries with all the other agencies who are due to respond to them before the multi-agency meeting on 7th July. All the relevant agencies are attending as well as senior representatives from LCC and the Mayoral office to ensure they can obtain as much support as possible in their endeavours to significantly reduce the risk of future severe flooding events in our village. The objective of the meeting is to agree a strategic action plan for our area, which will be made public once they have reached agreement with all the agencies. Their intention is to form a working group subsequently, with representatives from the relevant agencies which will meet at regular intervals to review progress in implementation of the agreed plan and arrange residents meetings to feedback progress,

We welcome – Ari Volanakis to the Council & sadly say goodbye to Julie, who due to work commitments has had to resign, so we'd like to take this opportunity to thank her for all her hard work during her term of office! This means that we still have 2 vacancies - ie opportunities for you to join us! Yes YOU! Planning applications - the Council raised concerns re **S25/0672** – proposed change of use of outbuildings at the Fortescue Arms to short term holiday accommodation, it had no objections to Crown Estate proposed woodland planting in various locations surrounding Billingborough.
