Billingborough Parish Council Newsletter November 2025

A time to remember the valour of those who selflessly gave their lives for our freedom – at this year's Remembrance Day service, being held in **St Andrews Church**, **Billingborough on** Sunday 9th November at 10.15am.

The Big Poppy Make – a MASSIVE THANK YOU to EVERYONE who made poppies for our Poppy appeal -2500 of them. Your time, creativity & community spirit have helped make a wonderful display & meaningful tribute to those who served. Special thanks go to the Pop in ladies & to Ann W who knitted an amazing 650 poppies!

You will then be invited to attend our November meeting on the 11th for selection via co-option.

The Parish Budget for 24/25 – will be discussed & drafted at our November meeting. We are keen to ensure that it will reflect the needs and priorities of our community. So please let our clerk know by 7th November about what matters to YOU! Or come to the public forum at our meeting and tell us. We can make choices on your behalf though it would be much better if our decisions were based on your desires!

Flooding updates - BFG recently held their first residents' feedback session, to update on the progress & implementation of the Strategic Flood Plan that they produced from the EA and Section 19 reports. They explained in some detail what actions will be required to deal with control of water upstream West of Billingborough through a flood alleviation scheme, the issues we are facing with the overall poor condition of the village drainage system and how we can get surface water that does break through onto roads through the village quicker and into drainage assets to the East of the village & outlined how the BFG will monitor progress with developments and hold the various authorities to account. Village Drainage System - they continue to strive to understand this & identify who is responsible for each asset. AW & LCC have been undertaking investigation works, often without informing them or us. BFG ask that if you see any such teams out, that if you are able to do so, you enquire what they are undertaking & post this information on BFG's Facebook page. Similarly, they'd value the contribution from all residents who have knowledge of our drainage systems and feel they can contribute to understanding the issues. Ousemere Lode to the West of Billingborough one of the actions from the Strategic Plan was to locate additional telemetry devices further upstream of the village as part of the early warning system for potential flooding events. They were pleased to announce that LCC obtained approval from the Environmental Agency to locate one device on Pipperdam Bridge and one on the bridge on Mareham Lane where the OML crosses. In addition, LCC are locating additional telemetry in Folkingham to also provide early warning of potential flood events. All data will be fed to an app that residents will be able to access once it is up & running. BFG intend to become a constituted group, as once registered they will be able to apply for grant funding from various sources to support local flood mitigation efforts. Volunteers required - once they have formalised their group, they will be looking for volunteers to form a community action group to work in collaboration with the various authorities in undertaking basic maintenance work such as keeping local drains, ditches, and other water courses clear as well as street gullies in an effort to keep assets clear as far as possible. If you are interested in helping to look after our village watercourses, then please contact Helen Middlebrook or Murray Turner via the BFG Facebook page. Everyone can help with qutter water flow by ensuring that the gutters outside or near your property are free from debris & by reporting any blocked drains on 'fixmystreet'. Stay safe & informed by signing up for flood alerts at - https://www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings.

Footpath to Pointon Update – we have been assured by Cllr Hill, that the much needed repairs to this will be undertaken in 2026.

Temporary road closure – 3/11/25 – 7/11/25 on Mareham Lane, for the removal of the foot bridge between 134m & 151m south of Billingborough Rd. Signage displaying accurate dates & times & alternative routes will be displayed on site in advance. **TTR012941**

SKDC updates – the **new Turnpike Lane waste disposal site**, is due to open to the public on **1**st **December** & the new food waste collection should be operational by **February 2026**. Since the District Council elections in May 2023, they have added **125** new houses to their rental housing stock, however; supply is still way below the need, as there are currently **1500** on their waiting list for a property.
